About Dawley Town Hall

Parts of Dawley are amongst the top 10% of most deprived areas in the UK. Dawley is a 10 minute drive away from our Telford office. We spotted a unique opportunity to support Telford and Wrekin Council's objective to put the heart back into Dawley, through providing both financial and volunteer support to help in the regeneration of Dawley Town Hall community centre.

What we did

- Donated **£10,000** towards the regeneration project
- Supplied **200** employees who volunteered time and expertise towards the redevelopment
- Provided **10** high-spec computers to furnish the Capgemini Cyber Cafe.

Through Capgemini's support, Dawley Town Hall is now the hub of this thriving community, providing opportunities for education, socialising and creative activities.

Cyber Cafe

At the centre of Dawley Town Hall sits the Capgemini Cyber Cafe. Capgemini staff installed 10 high spec refurbished computers which are used for web surfing and IT training. Many local students and job seekers looking to broaden their skills have completed the eight-weeks IT learning course held in the cafe.
